Entry restricted for international travelers

Most international travelers are not allowed to enter Canada.

All scheduled international commercial passenger flights must land at one of Canada's four largest airports: Montreal-Trudeau International Airport, Toronto Pearson International Airport, Calgary International Airport, and Vancouver International Airport.

## ADDITIONAL DETAILS

The travel restrictions do not apply to:

- Canadian citizens;
- Permanent residents;
- Extended family members include those in a long-term, exclusive dating relationship and their dependent children, plus adult children, grandchildren, siblings, and grandparents under certain conditions;
- Foreign nationals for compassionate reasons in specific and limited situations, including to say goodbye to a loved one, to provide care for a loved one, or to attend a funeral;
- Foreign nationals arriving directly from the US for a non-discretionary purpose;
- Indians under the Indian Act;
- International students approved by a provincial or territorial government as having a COVID-19 readiness plan will be allowed to enter Canada.

COVID-19 TEST

REQUIRED



BEFORE DEPARTURE

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a negative COVID-19 molecular test (PCR, RT-PCR, NAAT, LAMP) result. The test must be taken a maximum of 72 hours before the departure of their last direct flight to Canada.

#### TESTING TYPES

PCR Test RT	72 hours before final boarding
PCR Test Lamp	72 hours before final boarding
Test Nucleic	72 hours before final boarding
Acid Test	72 hours before final boarding
Molecular Test	72 hours before final boarding

---

#### ADDITIONAL DETAILS

This testing requirement does not apply to:

- Travelers under the age of 5;
- Transit passengers;
- Travelers who have previously tested positive for COVID-19, however, must provide proof of a positive COVID-19 molecular test taken between 14 and 90 days prior to departure; -Crew members;
- Essential services;
- Emergency services;
- National security or interest;
- Special exemptions.

#### ON ARRIVAL

Mandatory COVID-19 test on arrival

Travelers are required to take a COVID-19 test on arrival in Canada.

Travelers are also required to take another COVID-19 molecular test on day 8 of their 14-day quarantine. They will receive a COVID-19 test kit and instructions before leaving the airport/border. Those who refuse will receive a \$750 fine.

#### ADDITIONAL DETAILS

The mandatory test on arrival does not apply to:

- Travelers under the age of 5;

- Travelers who have molecular test proof to show they had a positive COVID-19 test taken between 14-90 days before travel;
- Travelers with extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances;
- Diplomatic, official, and courtesy visa holders and their immediate family;
- National interest travelers determined by the Minister of Health;
- Travelers already exempted from quarantine (such as travelers who regularly cross the border for work).

## ON ARRIVAL

Mandatory 14-day quarantine (first 3 days in a designated hotel)

Travelers including Canadian citizens and residents are required to quarantine for 14 days on arrival.

Travelers are required to take a COVID-19 test on arrival and quarantine for 3 days in an approved hotel while they await the results of their tests. Travelers are responsible for the costs of the hotel quarantine and COVID-19 test. Once released from the hotel quarantine, they will have to continue to quarantine at home until 14 days after arrival in Canada.

Travelers exempted from the COVID-19 test on arrival are also exempted from 3-day hotel quarantine. For more information on exemptions, please see the source.

Mandatory contact information form

All travelers are required to submit a quarantine plan and a COVID-19 'self-assessment' before getting on a flight. The information must be submitted digitally through the ArriveCAN app.

#### HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting Canada you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

##### **Required Vaccinations**

- There are no vaccinations required for entry to Canada.

##### **Routine and Recommended Vaccinations**

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- As hepatitis A outbreaks occur throughout the world and sometimes in countries with a low risk for hepatitis A, travellers should consult with their doctor prior to travel to see if the hepatitis A vaccine is necessary.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals and researchers, or for those who may come into contact with bats.

## CUSTOMS

### IMPORT REGULATIONS

#### Free to Import

#### Tobacco (restricted to travellers 18 years and over)

All of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 50 cigars;
- 200 grams of manufactured tobacco; and
- 200 tobacco sticks.

**Note: in order to qualify for a personal exemption on tobacco, all packages must be stamped "duty paid Canada droit acquitté".**

#### Alcohol (restricted to travellers 18 years and over in Alberta, Manitoba, and Quebec, and 19 years in other provinces of Canada)

One of the following:

- 1.5 litres of wine;
- 1.14 litres of spirits; or
- 8.5 litres of beer or ale.

#### Currency

- Any amount up to CAD\$10,000 (or foreign equivalent) can be freely imported or exported. Travellers must report anything over this amount to the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) when they arrive or leave. #### Other Goods

- Travellers may bring 'personal baggage' for their own use. This includes clothing, camping and sport goods, cameras and computers. These must leave Canada when the traveller leaves.
- Gifts can be imported if each gift is valued at CAD\$60 or less. Alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, or commercial goods may not be claimed as gifts.

- Seeing-eye dogs are allowed into Canada without restrictions.

## **Prohibited**

**The following are prohibited from being imported into Canada:**

- Child pornography;
- Hate propaganda;
- Obscene material;
- Counterfeit coins;
- Goods with a misleading country of origin; and
- White phosphorus matches.

## **Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR (swab) test result in English. The result must be taken within 72 hours before the first departure point to Indonesia.

## ADDITIONAL DETAILS

Travelers arriving without a COVID-19 PCR test will be required to take a test on arrival and quarantine until results are in at their own expense, which could take up to 5 days.

## HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting Indonesia you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

### Required Vaccinations

- There is no risk of yellow fever in Indonesia. The government of Indonesia requires proof of yellow fever vaccination from travellers 9 months of age or older who are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Yellow Fever Advice](#).

### Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in Indonesia, regardless of where they are eating or staying.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.
- Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Indonesia longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Consultation with a doctor regarding this vaccination should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Japanese Encephalitis Advice](#).
- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or moving to Indonesia, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites

## CUSTOMS

### IMPORT REGULATIONS

#### Free to Import

##### Tobacco

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 25 cigars; or
- 100 grams of tobacco.

##### Alcohol

- 1 litre of alcohol.

##### Currency

- Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

##### Other Goods

- A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

##### Prohibited

**The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.**

- Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

##### Restricted

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**
