Travelers including Japanese nationals are required to take a COVID-19 PCR test on arrival.

BEFORE DEPARTURE

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a negative COVID-19 (RT-PCR, LAMP, TMA, TRC, Smart Amp, NEAR, or CLEIA) test result. The test must be taken within 72 hours before departure.

This includes Japanese nationals, Business Track, and Residence Track travelers too.

Qualitative antigen tests are not accepted. Please check the source to verify the valid format for the certificate of negative results.

ADDITIONAL DETAILS

QUARANTINE

ON ARRIVAL

Mandatory 14-day quarantine

Travelers are required to quarantine for 14 days at a location designated by the quarantine station chief on arrival and to refrain from using public transportation. Some travelers may undergo additional COVID-19 testing during their quarantine.

This regulation does not apply to all regions of several of these countries. Travelers from some regions in Canada, US and Russia may be required to undergo a stricter quarantine and additional testing. Please check the source for more detailed information.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting Japan you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

Required Vaccinations

- There are no vaccinations required for entry to Japan.

Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- As hepatitis A outbreaks occur throughout the world and sometimes in countries with a low risk for hepatitis A, travellers should consult with their doctor prior to travel to see if the hepatitis A vaccine is necessary.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Japan longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. - A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals and researchers, or for those who may come into contact with bats.

CUSTOMS

IMPORT REGULATIONS

Free to Import

Alcohol (restricted to travellers 20 years and over)

- 3 bottles, at 760 mL per bottle.

Tobacco (restricted to travellers 20 years and over)

One of the following:

- 400 Japanese cigarettes and 400 foreign made cigarettes;
- 100 Japanese cigars and 100 foreign made cigars;
- 500 grams tobacco; or

- A proportionate amount of each not exceeding 500 grams.
- **Please note** residents of Japan and entitled to half of the amounts of tobacco listed above.

Currency

- There are no restrictions on the importation of currency into Japan.
- Any amount exceeding ¥1 million must be declared to Customs.

Other Goods

- 2 ounces of perfume.
- Clothes, toiletries, and other personal effects within an appropriate quantity.
- Other items up to ¥200,000 are free to import.
- Items under the value of ¥10,000 are free to import and are not included in above total.
- Individual items with a value of ¥200,000 or more cannot be included in duty free allowance.
- 100 kg per year of rice may be imported free of charge.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- Heroin, cocaine, MDMA, opium, cannabis, stimulants, psychotropic substances, and other narcotic drugs (excluding those designated by the Minister of Health, Labour and Welfare Ordinance).
- Firearms, ammunition, and gun parts.
- Explosives, such as dynamite and gunpowder.
- Precursor materials for chemical weapons.
- Counterfeit, altered, or imitation coins or notes, securities, and forged credit cards.
- Any obscene or immoral materials which may harm public safety or morals.
- Child pornography.
- Articles which infringe upon intellectual property rights.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.

- Hunting guns, air guns and swords need a permit for entry to Japan.
- Pharmaceutical products and cosmetics are subject to quantity restrictions. For further information, please visit the [Ministry of Health, Labour, and Welfare](#).

Free to Export

- Some tobacco and alcohol for personal use.
- Gifts and duty free shopping done in Japan.

Prohibited

- All items in prohibited to import list.

Restricted

Travelers are required to take a COVID-19 swab test on arrival. Travelers are required to quarantine at their own expense in a designated hotel for 5 days.

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR (swab) test result in English. The result must be taken within 72 hours before the first departure point to Indonesia.


TESTING TYPES

PCR Test 72 hours before departure

ADDITIONAL DETAILS

Travelers arriving without a COVID-19 PCR test will be required to take a test on arrival and quarantine until results are in at their own expense, which could take up to 5 days.

Required Vaccinations

- There is no risk of yellow fever in Indonesia. The government of Indonesia requires proof of yellow fever vaccination from travellers 9 months of age or older who are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

 - A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.
 - Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Indonesia longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Free to Import

Tobacco

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 25 cigars; or
- 100 grams of tobacco.

Alcohol

- 1 litre of alcohol.

Currency

- Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

Other Goods

- A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.
