Proof of negative COVID-19 test results for unvaccinated travelers

Unvaccinated travelers arriving from selected countries must have a negative NAAT test result. The test must be taken a maximum of 72 hours before arrival in the Netherlands. Tests accepted are PCR, RT PCR, LAMP, TMA, or mPOCT.

## HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting the Netherlands you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

### Required Vaccinations

- There are no vaccinations required for entry to the Netherlands.

### Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- As hepatitis A outbreaks occur throughout the world and sometimes in countries with a low risk for hepatitis A, travellers should consult with their doctor prior to travel to see if the hepatitis A vaccine is necessary.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals and researchers, or for those who may come into contact with bats.

## CUSTOMS

### IMPORT REGULATIONS

#### Free to Import

#### When travelling within EU

There are no limits on the amount of alcohol and tobacco a traveller can bring in within the EU. The goods must be for personal use or as a gift and they must have had duty and tax paid in the EU country where they were acquired. Customs officials may require proof of intent if more than **all** the following is imported.

#### Tobacco (restricted to travellers 17 years and over)

- 800 cigarettes;
- 400 cigarillos (max 3g each);
- 200 cigars;
- 1kg smoking tobacco.

#### Alcohol (restricted to travellers 17 years and over)

- 10 litres of spirits over 22%;
- 20 litres of alcoholic beverages, other than either wine or beer, less than 22% volume;
- 90 litres of wine (with a maximum 60 litres of sparkling wine);
- 110 litres of beer.

#### When travelling from outside the EU

If entering the EU from outside, passengers may bring with them duty-free goods for personal use within the limits set out below. The same applies if coming from the Canary Islands, the Channel Islands, Gibraltar or other territories where EU rules on VAT do not apply.

#### Tobacco (restricted to travellers 17 years and over)

**One** of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 100 cigarillos;
- 50 cigars;
- 250g of smoking tobacco; or

- A proportional combination of these goods (such as 100 cigarettes and 50 cigarillos).

### **Alcohol (restricted to travellers 17 years and over)**

**One** of the following:

- 1 litre exceeding 22% alcohol volume; or
- 2 litres up to 22% alcohol volume.

In addition, **both** of the following:

- 4 litres of still wine; and
- 16 litres of beer.

### **Currency**

- There are no restrictions on the importation of currency into the EU.
- Funds of more than €10,000 must be declared to the customs authorities.

### **Other Goods free from duty**

- Medicines for personal use. Travellers may be asked to provide a prescription for certain medications.
- Personal items of non-commercial nature worth up to €430 when travelling by air or sea.
- Personal items of non-commercial nature worth up to €300 when travelling by land.

### **Prohibited**

**The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.**

- Weapons, ammunition, and explosives, including objects that resemble real weapons.
- Counterfeit articles may not be imported if the traveller intends to use them for commercial purposes.
- Drugs such as hashish, cocaine, and heroin.

### **Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**

- Endangered animals, plants, and their derivative products protected under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) may require protected species permits. For further information, please visit the [Netherlands Enterprise Agency](#).
- Cats, dogs, and ferrets are subject to a mandatory health inspection at the first point of entry on EU territory. They must also have a microchip or tattoo, and have been properly vaccinated against rabies. A Common Veterinary Entry Document certifying the healthy inspection must be provided with the customs declaration. Pets travelling within the EU must have a valid pet passport. - **Authority**. Weapons used for hunting, shooting, and airsoft sports may be imported with a permit. For further information, please visit the [Central Import and Export Office](#).
- Certain cultural goods, such as art and antiques, may require a licence to be imported. For further information, please visit the [State Inspectorate for Cultural Heritage](#).
- Food products of animal origin, such as meat, dairy, and eggs, may only be imported from outside the EU with a health certificate.

- 2kg of products of animal origin such as milk powder, baby food, and food for medical purposes can be brought in personal baggage as long as they are still packaged and do not require
- refrigeration. Most plants, flowers, fruit, and vegetables require a phytosanitary certificate if they are being imported from outside the EU. If the quantity is below 5kg, this certificate may not be required. For further information, please visit [Phytosanitary Products](#).

## EXPORT REGULATIONS

### Free to Export

- No restriction for the quantity and value of exported items when leaving to non-E.U. countries.

### Prohibited

**The following are goods which cannot be taken out of the country.**

- All items in the prohibited import list.

### Restricted

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to departure.**

- There are no restrictions on the export of currency if leaving for another EU country. Funds of more than €10,000 must be declared when leaving the EU.
- Protected species and products protected under CITES. A permit is required for export.

### Required Vaccinations

- There is no risk of yellow fever in Indonesia. The government of Indonesia requires proof of yellow fever vaccination from travellers 9 months of age or older who are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. ### Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in Indonesia, regardless of where they are eating or staying.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.

- Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Indonesia longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Consultation with a doctor regarding this vaccination should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Japanese Encephalitis Advice](#).
  - A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or moving to Indonesia, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites

### IMPORT REGULATIONS

#### Free to Import

##### Tobacco

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 25 cigars; or
- 100 grams of tobacco.

##### Alcohol

- 1 litre of alcohol.

##### Currency

- Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

#### **Other Goods**

- A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

#### **Prohibited**

**The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.**

- Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

#### **Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**
