Entry restricted for international travelers

At this time, only travelers with a valid visa can enter South Korea. International travelers are required to apply for a visa in advance at an embassy in order to travel to South Korea.

Mandatory COVID-19 test on arrival

Travellers are required to take a COVID-19 test on arrival or a maximum of 3 days after their arrival in South Korea.

BEFORE DEPARTURE

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a printed negative COVID-19 (NAAT, PCR, LAMP, TMA, SDA, or NEAR) test result in English or Korean. The result must be issued a maximum of 72 hours before departure.

Electronic results such as on mobile devices are not accepted.

## ON ARRIVAL

Mandatory 14-day quarantine for unvaccinated travelers

Travelers who are not fully vaccinated must quarantine for 14 days on arrival in South Korea.

Travelers may be tested during quarantine.

## ADDITIONAL DETAILS

Travelers exempted from quarantine are:

- A1 or A2 visa holders;
- Vaccinated travelers who are Korean nationals with a Quarantine Exemption certificate issued by the embassy before travel;
- Travelers who were vaccinated in Korea and whose vaccinations are registered with the Korean health system may be eligible to be actively monitored instead of undergoing quarantine.

## HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting South Korea you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

### **Required Vaccinations**

- There are no vaccinations required for entry to South Korea.

### **Routine and Recommended Vaccinations and Medications**

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in South Korea, regardless of where they are eating or staying. A
- hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.
- Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in South Korea longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Consultation with a doctor regarding this vaccination should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Japanese Encephalitis](#).

- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or moving to South Korea, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites.

### CUSTOMS

#### IMPORT REGULATIONS

##### Free to Import

##### Tobacco (restricted to travellers 19 years and over)

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 50 cigars; or
- 250 grams of tobacco.

##### Alcohol (restricted to travellers 19 years and over)

1 litre of alcohol.

##### Agricultural, forest, fishery, and livestock products (oriental medicine materials)

- 5 kg of sesame oil, sesame seeds, and honey.
- 1 kg of pine nuts.
- 10kg of beef.
- 300g of ginseng (undried, white, or red), and sanghwang mushroom.
- 150g of deer antlers.
- 3kg of other oriental medicine materials.
- 5kg of other agricultural, forest, fishery, and livestock products.

The above goods must be worth less than \$100,000, and they must pass quarantine inspection.

##### Currency

Funds of US\$10,000 or more must be declared at Customs.

##### Other Goods

- 60 mL of perfume.
- Duty-free purchases must not exceed US\$600.

Other personal items worth up to US\$400.

##### Prohibited

**The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.**

- Narcotics drugs.
- Weaponry such as guns (including simulated ones), swords, crossbows, bullets, chemicals, and poisonous or radioactive materials.
- Items which infringe upon intellectual property rights.
- Counterfeit money.
- Books, pictures, movies, and other media which may cause harm to the national constitution, public peace, and social customs.

**Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**

- Agricultural, forest, livestock, fishery, and plant products.
- Animal and plant species and their derivative products as outlined by the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) will require permissions from CITES. For more information see [Confirmation of Required Conditions for Export and Import](#).

**EXPORT REGULATIONS**

**Free to Export**

- Duty-free shopping on departure must not exceed US\$3000.

**Prohibited**

**The following are goods which cannot be taken out of the country.**

- All items on the prohibited to import list.

**Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to departure.**

- Luxury watches, cameras, jewellery, gems, fur, and A-level golf clubs.
- Foreign currency and Korean won exceeding the value of US\$10,000 must be declared.
- High priced items that have been declared upon entry need to be declared upon exit.
- Articles specified by other laws and regulations, such as cultural assets.  
Gold which is not part of personal jewellery such as gold bars must be declared.

Travelers must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR (swab) test result in English. The result must be taken within 72 hours before the first departure point to Indonesia.

Travelers arriving without a COVID-19 PCR test will be required to take a test on arrival and quarantine until results are in at their own expense, which could take up to 5 days.

### IMPORT REGULATIONS

#### Free to Import

#### Tobacco

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 25 cigars; or
- 100 grams of tobacco.

#### **Alcohol**

- 1 litre of alcohol.

#### **Currency**

- Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

#### **Other Goods**

- A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

#### **Prohibited**

**The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.**

- Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

#### **Restricted**

**These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.**
