Unvaccinated travelers must have a printed or electronic negative COVID-19 test result. The test must be a PCR test taken a maximum of 72 hours before arrival or an antigen test taken a maximum of 48 hours or arrival in Turkey.

Travelers arriving in Turkey are required to undergo a medical evaluation for symptoms of COVID-19,

including temperature checks and if they have symptoms they will take a COVID-19 PCR test. If the test is positive, the traveler will be required to quarantine for 14 days and may undergo a test on the 10th day to be released. Travelers should check whether their health insurance policy includes coverage for COVID-19.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting Turkey you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

Required Vaccinations

There are no vaccinations required for entry to Turkey.

Routine and Recommended Vaccinations and Medications

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps -rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots
- A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in Turkey, regardless of where they are eating or
- staying.
 - A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a
- new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
 - A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends
- or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.

 A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or
- moving to Turkey, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites.
 Malaria is a risk in Turkey. Travellers to certain areas who are at higher risk for complications from malaria (such as pregnant women) may need to take anti-malarial medicine. Consultation with a doctor regarding this medication should be sought prior to travel.

CUSTOMS

IMPORT REGULATIONS

Free to Import

Tobacco (restricted to travellers 18 years and over)

All of the following:

- 600 cigarettes;
- 100 cigarillos;
- 50 cigars; and
- 250 grams of shredded tobacco (with 200 cigarettes sheets); and
 250 grams of pipe tobacco.

Alcohol (restricted to travellers 18 years and over)

Both of the following:

1 litre exceeding 22% alcohol volume; and
 2 litres up to 22% alcohol volume.

Currency

There are no restrictions on the importation of currency into Turkey.

Other goods

Personal goods such as clothing, personal electronics, musical instruments, sports equipment, and toys.

- 5 bottles up to 120mL each of perfume, cologne, essence, or lotion.
- 1kg each of tea, instant coffee, coffee, chocolate, sugar.
- Personal jewellery not for resale up to a value of US\$15,000.
- Gifts of a non-commercial nature worth up to 12/2430 for travellers 15 years and over.
- Gifts of a non-commercial nature worth up to "¿½150 or travellers under 15 years of age.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- · All narcotics and their derivatives.
- Organic fertiliser used for agricultural purposes.
- Police speed traps.
- Homemade alcoholic beverages.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.

- 2 pets or 10 aquarium fish may be imported per traveller. The pets must be accompanied by a certificate of vaccination, an official veterinary certificate, and a vet passport or identification card. The pets will then be subject to inspection by a veterinarian upon arrival.
- Products of animal and plant origin may be subject to veterinary inspection at the border, and may require a Certificate of Conformity.

EXPORT REGULATIONS

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be taken out of the country.

- · Goods of natural and cultural heritage.
- Hemp.
- Tobacco seeds.
- Timber and products from the following tree and plants: walnut, mulberry, cherry, pear, plum, yew, ash, elm, lime, sweetgum, elder, cretan date palm, olive, fig, and salep. Natural flower
- bulbs.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to departure.

- Funds of more than US\$5000 or its equivalent in any other currency must be declared to the customs authorities.
- The value of jewellery being exported may only exceed the value of jewellery imported if it is accompanied by a receipt showing proof of purchase in Turkey.

- A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in Indonesia, regardless of where they are eating or staying.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.
- Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Indonesia longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Consultation with a doctor regarding this vaccination should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC Japanese Encephalitis Advice.
- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or moving to Indonesia, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites

IMPORT REGULATIONS

Free to Import

Tobacco

One of the following:

- · 200 cigarettes;
- · 25 cigars; or
- · 100 grams of tobacco.

Alcohol

• 1 litre of alcohol.

Currency

• Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

Other Goods

- · A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- · Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- · Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.
