- Certain family members of U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents including; spouses, children (under the age of 21), parents (provided that his/her U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident child is unmarried and under the age of 21), and siblings (provided that both the sibling and the U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident are unmarried and under the age of 21);
- Investors, treaty traders, academics, and students from the Schengen Area countries, Ireland, and the United Kingdom with valid visas.

REQUIRED



BEFORE DEPARTURE

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have an original printed or electronic negative COVID-19 viral test result (NAAT: RT-PCR, RT-LAMP, TMA, NEAR, HDA, or Antigen: Rapid). The test must be performed a maximum of 3 days

before the first scheduled departure time in the flight itinerary.

This requirement applies to all travelers, including US citizens, residents, and transit travelers, as well as travelers who have been vaccinated.

This testing requirement does not apply to:

- Travelers under the age of 2;
- Travelers who have recovered from COVID-19. These travelers must show proof of a positive viral test from the preceding 90 days and a letter from their healthcare provider or public health official stating they are cleared to end isolation.

ON ARRIVAL

Recommended quarantine

Travelers are recommended to quarantine between 7-10 days after arrival in the United States. Travelers are recommended to take a COVID-19 test 3-5 days after arriving in the USA. If the test is negative, it is recommended that travelers quarantine for 7 days. If the test is positive, they should self-isolate until they recover.

Travelers should check quarantine requirements for the specific state they are traveling to, as some states may require mandatory quarantine for international travelers.

ADDITIONAL DETAILS

This recommendation does not apply to:

- Travelers who are considered fully vaccinated: 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.
 - Travelers who have recovered from COVID-19. These travelers must show proof of a positive viral test from the preceding 90 days and a letter from their healthcare provider or public health official stating they are cleared to end isolation.

 HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting the USA you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

Required Vaccinations

- There are no vaccinations required for entry to the USA.

Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
- As hepatitis A outbreaks occur throughout the world and sometimes in countries with a low risk for hepatitis A, travellers should consult with their doctor prior to travel to see if the hepatitis A vaccine is necessary.
- A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
- A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals and researchers, or for those who may come into contact with bats.

General Advice

- Zika may be a risk in the USA. Because of the risk of birth defects in babies born to women who were infected with Zika while pregnant, women who are pregnant or planning to become pregnant should discuss their travel plans with their doctor. CUSTOMS

IMPORT REGULATIONS

Free to Import

US Citizens and Permanent Residents

Tobacco and alcohol may only be imported by travellers 21 years and over.

Returning from a Caribbean Basin Initiative (CBI) country

Travellers returning from CBI countries have an allowance of up to US\$800 of dutiable items including:

2 litres of alcohol, 1 litre of which must be a product of a CBI country.

Returning from the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa or Guam

Travellers returning from these territories have an allowance of up to US\$1600 of dutiable items including:

- 1000 cigarettes, 800 of which must be purchased in one of the above territories (receipts are necessary).
- 5 litres of alcohol, 4 litres of which must be purchased in one of the above territories, and 1 litre of which must be a product of that territory.

Returning from Cuba

Travellers returning from Cuba have an allowance of up to US\$400 of dutiable items including:

Alcohol and tobacco products with a combined value of up to US\$100.

Returning from any other foreign country

Travellers have an allowance of up to US\$800 of dutiable items including:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 100 cigars; and
- 1 litre of alcohol.

Returning from a foreign country except Mexico after less than 48 hours or more than once in a 30-day period

Travellers in this situation have an allowance of up to US\$200 of dutiable items including:

- 50 cigarettes;
- 10 cigars; and
- 150mL alcohol or 150mL perfume.

Currency

- There are no restrictions on the importation of funds into the US. Funds of US\$10,000 or more must be declared.

Non-Residents

Tobacco and alcohol may only be imported by travellers 21 years and over.

Tobacco

- 200 cigarettes; and
- 100 cigars.

Alcohol

- 1 litre of alcohol.

Other Goods

- Visitors travelling to the US for over 72 hours have an allowance of up to US\$100 of dutiable items intended as gifts for other people. This allowance may be used once every six months, and may include 100 cigars. This gift exemption applies to individuals, and may not be combined in a family group.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- Absinthe containing thujone.
- Products containing dog and cat fur.
- Illegal drug paraphernalia.
- Anything containing meat products, including soup mixes.
- Copies of gold coins are prohibited if not properly marked by country of issuance.
- Certain medications such as rohypnol are prohibited. For further information, please visit the [US Food and Drug Administration](#).
- Merchandise from Cuba, Iran, Myanmar, and Sudan is prohibited. To bring in merchandise from these countries, travellers will need a specific licence from the Office of Foreign Assets Control. - Film will be examined if it is believed to contain prohibited material such as child pornography.
- Pirated or counterfeit goods are prohibited.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.

- Alcohol is subject to restrictions depending on which state you are arriving in. For further information, please contact the relevant state's alcohol beverage control board.
- Automobiles must meet American standards. For further information, please visit the United States Environmental Protection Agency [Importing Vehicles and Engines into the United States](#), and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration [Vehicle Importation and Certification Requirements](#). Permits may be required in order to import biological specimens including bacterial cultures, molluscs, livestock, birds, and plants. - Certain fish and wildlife, along with derivative products, are subject to import restrictions. For further information, please visit the [US Fish and Wildlife Service](#).

- Classified and unclassified items that have military application are considered defence articles, and require a licence before import and export. For further information, please visit the [Directorate of Defense Trade Control](#).
- Firearms and ammunition must be imported through a licenced importer. Anything prohibited by the National Firearms Act will be prohibited unless written authorisation is provided by the [Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives](#).
- Fruit and vegetables may be allowed in, depending on the country of origin. For further information, please visit USDA [Permits and Certifications](#).
- Game and hunting trophies may require a permit, depending on country of origin. For further information, please visit the US Fish and Wildlife Service [Information on Hunting and Fishing](#).
- Haitian goat hide drums are restricted if they have not been properly processed so that they are not infectious.
- Prescription medication must be in its original container, with the prescription printed on the container. Travellers should bring no more than is required for personal use - usually no more than 90 days' worth. Medical devices should also be accompanied by a doctor's prescription. All medication should be declared.
- All plants and plant products must be declared. Some require permits, and some may be prohibited. For further information, please visit the USDA [Plant Health Import Permits](#). Soil is prohibited unless accompanied by an import permit.
- All pets are subject to importation requirements, and some are prohibited. For further information, please visit the Centers for Disease Control [Bringing an Animal into the United States](#).
- Airlines should verify that any dog travelling to the United States has either a valid rabies vaccination certificate, a CDC-issued unimmunized dog permit, or a written statement that the dog has been living in a rabies-free country for the past 6 months or since birth. These requirements apply to dogs travelling in the cabin or the cargo hold of a plane.
- Airlines should also verify that any dog travelling to the United States matches the details on their identifying documentation, such as age, sex, breed, colour, and markings. Service dogs are
- subject to the same controls and restrictions as pet dogs.

EXPORT REGULATIONS

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be taken out of the country.

- Narcotics and some medication containing prohibited substances.
- Absinthe or alcohols containing Artemisia Absinthium.
- Items infringing trade and copyright regulations.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to departure.

- Artefacts from Byzantine period, Pre-Colombian period, Khmer sculptures (unless accompanied by licences) or items of archaeological, historical, cultural, scientific and religious importance.

- Endangered species and their derivative products protected under CITES require a permit for export.
- Biological material including specimens of bacteria, fungus, and viruses require a permit through [APHIS Animal Plant and Health Inspection Service](#). Funds of US\$10,000 or more must be
- declared

Mandatory COVID-19 test on arrival

Travelers are required to take a COVID-19 swab test on arrival. Travelers are required to quarantine at their own expense in a designated hotel for 5 days.

BEFORE DEPARTURE

Proof of negative COVID-19 test results

Travelers must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR (swab) test result in English. The result must be taken within 72 hours before the first departure point to Indonesia.

TESTING TYPES

PCR Test 72 hours before departure

ADDITIONAL DETAILS

Travelers arriving without a COVID-19 PCR test will be required to take a test on arrival and quarantine until results are in at their own expense, which could take up to 5 days.

Travelers must quarantine for 5 days at a facility designated by the Indonesian government. Travelers must take a COVID-19 test during quarantine. If they test positive they must be relocated to a hospital. Those who test negative must continue a period of home quarantine.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

Before visiting Indonesia you may need to get the following vaccinations or take the following precautions. It is best to seek medical advice as your individual health and your planned activities will be a factor. Seek advice 4-6 weeks before travel.

Required Vaccinations

- There is no risk of yellow fever in Indonesia. The government of Indonesia requires proof of yellow fever vaccination from travellers 9 months of age or older who are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Yellow Fever Advice](#).

Routine and Recommended Vaccinations

- It is recommended that travellers are up to date on routine vaccinations including measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-pertussis-tetanus (DPT), varicella (chickenpox), polio, and yearly flu shots.
 - A hepatitis A vaccination is recommended as travellers may contract hepatitis A through contaminated food or water in Indonesia, regardless of where they are eating or staying.
 - A hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for those who may have sexual contact with a new partner, who may get a tattoo or piercing, or have any medical procedures.
 - A typhoid vaccination is recommended for most travellers, especially those staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or for those that are adventurous eaters.
 - Travellers may need a Japanese Encephalitis vaccination depending on their travel plans, particularly if they will be in Indonesia longer than a month or plan to visit rural areas or spend significant time outdoors. Consultation with a doctor regarding this vaccination should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Japanese Encephalitis Advice](#).
 - A rabies vaccination is recommended for those planning an outdoor holiday, for wildlife professionals such as veterinarians and researchers, for those who are taking a long trip or moving to Indonesia, and children as they are more likely to receive animal bites
 - Malaria is a risk in Indonesia. Travellers to certain areas may need to take anti-malarial medication. Consultation with a doctor regarding this medication should be sought prior to travel. For further information on this recommendation, please visit the CDC [Malaria in Indonesia](#).
- **Note: Chloroquine is NOT an effective anti-malarial medication in Indonesia.**

General Advice

- Zika is a risk in Indonesia. Because of the risk of birth defects in babies born to women who were infected with Zika while pregnant, women who are pregnant or planning to become pregnant should discuss their travel plans with their doctor. IMPORT REGULATIONS

Free to Import

Tobacco

One of the following:

- 200 cigarettes;
- 25 cigars; or
- 100 grams of tobacco.

Alcohol

- 1 litre of alcohol.

Currency

- Funds of more than Rp100,000,000 or its foreign equivalent must be declared to the customs authorities.

Other Goods

- A reasonable quantity of perfume.
- Personal goods up to the value of US\$250 per individual or US\$1000 per family.

Prohibited

The following are goods which cannot be brought into the country.

- Narcotics and psychotropic drugs.
- Pornographic materials.
- Firearms and weapons.

Restricted

These goods are strictly regulated, and in most cases require a permit to be obtained prior to arrival.
